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RULES AND REGULATIONS

**For the Four Year Degree Program in Engineering at
University College of Engineering (Autonomous)
Osmania University, Hyderabad - 500 007, TG.**

(With effect from the academic year 2026 -2027)

Note:

1. All the Rules and Regulations, hereinafter specified shall be read as a whole for the purpose of interpretation.
2. Any reference to College in these Rules and Regulations stands for University College of Engineering (Autonomous), Osmania University.

I. ADMISSION

1. A candidate for admission into the Four Year Degree Program in Engineering must have passed the Intermediate Examination of the Board of Intermediate Education, Government of Telangana with Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry as optional courses or Biology, Physics and Chemistry as optional courses or any other examination recognized by the Osmania University as equivalent thereto.
2. All the eligible applicants shall qualify at the Common Entrance Examination. The candidates will be admitted strictly in accordance with the merit secured at the Entrance Examination conducted by the State Government of Telangana, keeping in view the rules in force regarding the reservations of seats to various categories of candidates.

II. DURATION AND PROGRAMS OF STUDY

1. The duration of the program is four years with eight semesters: I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII and VIII semesters. Each academic year shall comprise of two semesters.

Instruction per semester	---- 16 weeks
Preparation holidays (including practical exams)	---- 2 weeks

- ❖ No admission / re-admission / promotion are entertained after **four weeks** of the commencement of instruction. However, a student may be permitted conditionally to attend the next semester course work with an undertaking till he/she attains eligibility with due permission from the Principal.
- ❖ In case there are any court cases consequent to which the authorities are compelled to admit any candidate after the announced last date of admissions, the admission (seat) of such a student would be reserved for the subsequent year on a supernumerary basis.
- ❖ No refund of tuition fee will be made after the commencement of instruction for students who wish to cancel their admission.

2. The following programs of study are offered in the College.

- i) Civil Engineering
- ii) Mechanical Engineering
- iii) Electrical and Electronics Engineering
- iv) Electronics and Communication Engineering
- v) Biomedical Engineering
- vi) Computer Science and Engineering
- vii) Mining Engineering
- viii) Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning

The schedule of study of all programs is regulated by the Academic Council of the University College of Engineering (Autonomous), Osmania University.

- 3. Each candidate will be allotted to one of the programs at the time of admission by the Convener, TG-EAPCET admissions, strictly depending on the merit secured at the Entrance Examination, and subject to the rules in force regarding reservations of seats.
- 4. Candidate who fails to fulfill all the requirements for the award of the degree as specified here within (N+2) academic years from the time of admission, will forfeit his/her seat in the program and his/her admission will stand cancelled, where 'N' is the normal duration of program of study (i.e 4 years).

III. RULES AND REGULATIONS OF ATTENDANCE

1. Candidates admitted to a particular program of study are required to pursue a “Regular program of study” before they are permitted to appear for the Semester End Examination. “A regular program of study” means putting in attendance of not less than 75% in each semester.
- 2 a) In special cases and for sufficient cause shown, the Principal may, on the specific recommendations of the Head of the Department, condone the deficiency in attendance to the extent of 10% on medical grounds subject to submission of medical certificate and payment of condonation fee.

b) However, in respect of women candidates who seek condonation of attendance due to pregnancy, the Principal may condone the deficiency in attendance to the extent of 15% (as against 10% condonation for others) on medical grounds subject to submission of medical certificate to this effect. Such condonation shall not be availed twice during the program of study.
3. The fee for condonation of attendance on medical grounds shall be **Rs. 2,000/-** (Rupees Two Thousand only) payable through **Online**.
4. Attendance of NCC / NSS Camps or Inter collegiate or Inter University or Inter State or International matches or debates or Educational Excursions or such other Inter University activities as approved by the authorities involving journeys outside the city in which the college is situated will be counted as leave. (i) Such leave shall not exceed four (4) weeks per semester of the total period of instructions. (ii) Such leave should be availed with prior permission from the Principal and not be availed more than twice during the program of study. (iii) Without any prior permission, such leave shall be treated as absence. (iv) While

calculating the attendance, the number of classes not attended in each subject is subtracted in the denominator.

5. The attendance shall be calculated on the aggregate of the courses from the date of commencement of classes (or date of re-admission in case of detained candidates) as per the almanac communicated by the University College of Engineering.
6. In case of the candidates who fail to put in the required attendance in a program of study, he/she shall be detained in the same semester and will not be permitted to appear for the Semester End Examination. Such candidates shall have to seek readmission into the same semester during the subsequent year in order to appear for the examination after fulfilling the attendance requirements and on payment of requisite tuition fee.
- 7 a) Candidates admitted to the first semester but having less than 40% attendance in the first semester would forego their seat and his/her admission gets cancelled.
- b) Candidates admitted to the first semester and detained by having attendance between 40%-74% can seek readmission in next academic year without once again appearing for the entrance test.

IV SCHEME OF INSTRUCTION AND EXAMINATION

1. Instruction in the various courses in all the semesters shall be provided by the College as per the schemes of instruction and as per the prescribed syllabi.
2. The distribution of marks/grade for sessionals based on **Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)** and the **Semester End Examination (SEE)** shall be as follows:

- * Out of 40 CIE marks for theory, 10 marks are allotted for experiential learning such as Assignments/ Tutorials/ Quizzes Industrial/Field Visits etc., in the course (At least two assignments and two quizzes shall be conducted). The remaining 30 marks are allotted based on average of Class Test - I and Class Test - II.

Two class tests will be conducted in each semester. Each test will carry 30 marks, having 4 questions each consists of 10 marks. Question 1 (Compulsory) consists of Five Short Answer Questions (SAQ) each 2 marks. Answer any TWO from the remaining 3 questions. Average of two class tests plus marks obtained in experiential learning will be taken as sessional marks (CIE).

- **** Out of 25 CIE marks for Practical, 10 marks are allotted for viva-voce exam / test and 15 marks for laboratory record and observations.
- *#** Out of 50 SEE marks for Practical Examination, 15 marks are allotted for procedure/ circuits diagram/ Model graphs/ Tables/Preliminary program/ Psedo code/ flow chart. 15 marks are allotted for Performing Experiment/Debugging of Priliminary program/Execution of program. 10 marks are allotted for output/Results Analysis/Graphics/Conclusions and 10 marks for Viva-Voce exam.
- ***** The SEE (60 Marks) question paper consists of Seven questions and each question carries 12 marks. The Question No. 1 covers entire syllabus comprising sub questions such as 1(a) to 1(f). Student has to answer Five Questions, in which Q.No. 1 is compulsory and any Four questions from remaining Six questions.
- #** The CIE evaluation of BE Project Phase - I & II, out of 50 CIE marks 25 marks to be awarded by the supervisor and the remaining 25 marks should be awarded by the committee constituted by the head of the Department. Marks will be distributed as per the Rubric given below:

(i) Supervisor has to allot **25** Marks based on the following rubrics

- Note: (i) A course that has CIE marks but no Semester End Examination as per scheme is treated as Pass / NC (not cleared) course for which pass marks are 50% of CIE.
- (ii) The student who is selected for 6-12 months internship through TPO, has to get permission from the respective HoD. Based on the recommendations, the Principal will issue an official permission letter authorizing the student to undertake the industrial internship.

For the students opted for such internship, credits for the VII-Semester can be earned through (i) Industrial Internship evaluation and (ii) NPTEL courses **or** Professional core courses (CIE and SEE) offered by the respective departments with the permission of Head of the department.

NPTEL courses: Equivalent NPTEL courses for Program Core subjects are to be registered from the recognised course list approved by the Chairperson BoS of the department. In case if the candidate failed to clear the online course then the candidate who has already been completed the equivalent course (the course which is not covered under regular scheme/Minor/Honor) in the previous semester can be considered.

The Professional electives, Open electives and Labs will be exempted and compensated with industrial internship evaluation as given below:

(iii) The candidates who register for online courses in VIII-Semester and fail to complete the online course will not be awarded the degree in that academic year. The candidate should reappear and clear the subject through online only as per the CBoS recommendation.

3. Total number of credits shall be 160 to 170, as per the Departmental requirements.

Total marks for theory course (CIE + SEE) = 100

Grades are allotted based on the marks secured in Semester End Examination and CIE as per the following criteria.

Evaluation of Grading System

- ❖ Grading System shall be followed for all B.E. Programs.
Theory: The minimum Criteria to award a Letter Grade and Grade Point is to get minimum percentage of marks for SEE = 40% and put together (CIE + SEE) = 40%.
Practical: The minimum Criteria to award a Letter Grade and Grade Point is to get minimum percentage of marks for SEE = 50% and put together (CIE + SEE) = 50%.
- ❖ As a measure of student's performance, a 10-scale grading system using the following letter grades and corresponding grade points per credit shall be followed. Grading will be done based on the total marks obtained by the student in that course.
- ❖ A course has the marks of SEE less than 40% or CIE + SEE put together less than 40% is treated as Fail and the grade will be awarded as NC (Not Cleared) and Grade Points Zero.
- ❖ For Courses those have only CIE marks, the student shall obtain a minimum of 50% to consider as Pass and corresponding letter grade as given in the table shall be awarded based on the obtained CIE marks. In case marks secured less than 50%, it is treated as Fail and a letter grade awarded as NC. (i.e. Seminar/Surveying Camp etc.)

- * NC/AB Grade shall be awarded to the student who is ABSENT for SEE.
- The details of instruction period, examination schedule, vacation etc. shall be notified by the Principal of the College time to time.
 - The medium of instruction and examination shall be in English.
 - The examinations pertaining to the current semester will be called main examinations and the examinations that are not cleared in the previous semesters will be called backlogs/supplementary examinations.
- To enable the B.E. Final Year students to complete the program requirements in time, there shall be a Make-up Exam for VIII semester only, which will be scheduled within one month of publication of results of VIII semester Main Examinations.
- The examinations prescribed may be conducted by means of written papers, practical and oral tests, inspection of certified sessional work in Drawing, Laboratories and Workshop, or by means of any combination of these methods as may be deemed necessary.

Candidates will be required to produce complete Lab Records of the Practical work done by them in each practical examination, along with other materials prepared or collected as part of Laboratory work / Project.

8. All the general rules for examinations (given under XII) shall be adhered to.
9. A candidate shall be deemed to have fully passed the SEE, if he/she secures not less than the minimum marks/grade as prescribed. Minimum pass marks / grade in the Semester End Examinations plus Continuous Internal Evaluation shall be

10. In case of hearing impaired, orthopedically handicapped and visually challenged candidates, 10% reduction in pass marks in each course is admissible as per G.O. Ms. No.150, dated 31-08-2006.
11. If a candidate in any semester examination of the program is unable to secure the minimum grade in any course, then he/she shall have to appear only in the failed course of the semester.
12. If a candidate has any grievance on the Evaluation of SEE, he/she can apply for Review of answer script(s) as per notification of the Examination Cell. Such grievances will be addressed by the Department Appeal Committee (DAC) and based on recommendations of DAC, necessary amendments in marks awarded will be incorporated by the Director of Evaluation, Examination Cell, UCE (A), OU.

A candidate can also obtain a photocopy of the corrected answer book of the theory subjects SEE only on payment of Rs.1,000/-

(Rupees One thousand only) for each course, through online payment to the Examination Cell UCE, OU, as per their notification.

V. MINOR PROGRAM

Minor is an additional credential for a student to earn, if she/he does **18** credits worth of additional courses in a discipline other than her/his major discipline of B.E. programs. All departments of the college offer minors in their disciplines, and will prescribe a specific set of courses and/or projects necessary for earning a Minor degree in that discipline. Tuition fee for the entire Minor Program is Rs. 25,000/-.

- i. Students with a minimum of 7.00 CGPA without any 'NC' Grade/Backlogs up to IV-Semester are only allowed to register for Minor Program offered by any other Department.
- ii. Number of credits required for Minor Program is 18 with 6 courses (of each 3 Credits) or 5 courses + 1 Project (of 3 credits) or 5 courses + 3 Laboratories (of each 1 credit) as per the Departmental requirements.
- iii. Courses for Minor Program start from V-Semester onwards.
- iv. Minimum and maximum number of students for any Minor program is 10 and 60 respectively.
- v. Students shall be prepared to write more than one exam in a day.
- vi. If any student wishes to exit from the Minor Program he/she will forfeit the tuition fee paid towards the registration of Minor program.
- vii. After successful completion of the Minor program requirements, the student will be awarded a degree in "name of the discipline" with Minor program in "name of the Minor specialization".

VI. HONORS PROGRAM

Under any circumstances Honors is an additional credential for a student to earn, if she/he does **18** credits worth of additional courses in her/his own discipline. The concerned department specifies the set of courses for earning Honors degree. Tuition fee for the entire Honor Program is Rs. 25,000/-.

- i. Students with a minimum of 7.5 CGPA without any 'F/NC' Grade/Backlogs up to IV-Semester are only allowed to register for Honors Program offered by that department.
- ii. Number of credits required for Honors program is 18 with 6 courses (of each 3 credits) or 5 courses + 1 Project (of 3 credits) or 5 courses + 3 Laboratories (of each 1 credit) as per the Departmental requirements.
- iii. Courses for **Honors** Program start from V-Semester and the student is required to plan registration for Honors courses, in order to complete all the six courses by the end of VIII-Semester.
- iv. Students shall be prepared to write more than one exam in a day.
- v. Students shall not have any backlogs in the subsequent semesters of the regular program in order to keep the registration for Honors program active.
- vi. Students have to complete the courses offered in Honors program in Single attempt only. There will not be any backlogs or make up examination for Honors program courses. The student must give an undertaking to exit from the Honors program, if he/she is unable to complete the courses in single attempt. Further, they will forfeit the tuition fee paid towards the registration of Honors program.
- vii. After successful completion of the Honors program, the student will be awarded a degree in "name of the discipline" with "Honors".

Note: 1. If a candidate has more than permitted number of credits as backlogs, he/she will be detained.

2. The candidate who wishes to take readmission into the year in which he/she is detained have to pay the total tuition fee of that year and all the credits earned during that year shall become null and void.

VIII. GRADING SYSTEM

1. Candidates who have passed all the examinations of the B.E. Program shall be awarded CGPA in accordance with the grade secured by them in all eight Semesters taken together, including the sessional marks secured in those semesters.

The grade secured shall be shown in the Grade Card as per the performance in SEE and CIE.

A minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 5 is required for the award of Degree. The consolidate Grade Card will reflect the credits / grade scored in each subject.

2. **SEMESTER GRADE POINT AVERAGE (SGPA) & CUMULATIVE GRADE POINT AVERAGE (CGPA) Calculation:**

$$(a) \text{ SGPA} = \frac{\sum(\text{Letter Grade Point} \times \text{Credits})}{\sum \text{Credits}}$$

SGPA is calculated upto second decimal point and it is calculated only when all subjects in that semester are Cleared / Passed.

$$(b) \text{ CGPA} = \frac{\sum \left[(\text{SGPA})_j \times (\text{Total Credits}) \right]}{\sum \text{Total Credits}}$$

Where “j” represents the semester
CGPA at a given point of Semester is calculated upto second decimal point. It is calculated only when total credits earned are equal to total credits prescribed as per scheme upto a semester in which the candidate has last appeared for SEE.

- (c) Courses in which the candidate has failed are not included in computing SGPA /CGPA.

IX AWARD OF DEGREE

- i. The degree of Bachelor of Engineering will be conferred to candidate who has pursued a regular program of study of four academic years prescribed in the scheme of instruction and has passed all the examinations.
- ii. Earned 18 credits more in **minor** specializations as prescribed by the department will be awarded the minor degree in the concerned program.
- iii. Earned 18 credits more in **honor** specializations as prescribed by the department will be awarded honor degree in the same program.

X. AWARD OF GOLD MEDAL

- (i) A student securing highest percentage of marks based on aggregate marks of all the semesters divided by the total maximum marks of all the semesters calculated up to two decimal accuracy. If the tie arises then the student who scores maximum total aggregate marks from second year to fourth year can be considered. All the Gold Medals are instituted by the donors only.
- (ii) (ii) A readmitted student by virtue of detention is not eligible for Gold Medal/Rank Certificate/Cash Award.

XI. IMPROVEMENT OF OVERALL SCORE

1. A candidate who wishes to improve his/her Overall score may do so within one academic year immediately after having passed all the examinations of the B.E. degree program, by reappearing in not more than two semesters (all subjects pertaining to the semester taken together) examinations.
2. For the award of the Overall score, he/she will have the benefit of the higher of the two aggregates of marks / grade secured in the corresponding semester(s).

XII. GENERAL RULES OF EXAMINATIONS

1. Application for permission to appear at every examination shall be made by online Examination Application Form (EAF) through College Website (www.uceou.edu) as per the notification.
2. When a candidate's application is found in order and he/she is eligible to appear in Semester End Examination (SEE), the Director of Evaluation, Examination Cell, University College of Engineering (Autonomous) shall furnish him/her with a Hall-Ticket, enabling the candidate to appear in the Semester End Examination. The Hall-Ticket shall have to be produced by the Candidate before he/she is admitted to the premises where the Examination is likely to be held.
3. A Candidate who does not present himself/herself for examination for any reason whatsoever shall not be entitled to claim refund of the whole or part of the examination fee, for subsequent Examination(s).
4. A candidate after he/she has been declared successful in the all examinations, shall be given a provisional certificate stating the year of examination, the branch in which he/she was examined and, the overall grade secured. However, the candidates have to obtain Degree Certificate (Convocation) from the Examination Branch, Osmania University.
5. Students who have appeared once in any examination of the program need not put in fresh attendance, if they wish to reappear at the corresponding examination, notwithstanding the fact that the college may have introduced new courses. They will, however, have to appear at the examinations according to the scheme of examination any syllabi in force.

XIII. TRANSITORY REGULATIONS

1. Whenever a syllabus of a course is changed by more than 40% with respect to old syllabus then the supplementary candidates appearing for the examination of this course has to be conducted with old syllabus for two times in the subsequent year. The Candidates not appearing for this old syllabus examinations or failing in them shall take the examination subsequently according to the changed syllabus /regulations.

XIV. MALPRACTICE AND AWARD OF PUNISHMENT

Guilty of assaulting / abusing intimidating any person connected with the examination work any time before, during or after the examination	Cancelling the result of all examinations taken or proposed to be taken during that session and the next session and prohibiting admission into or continuation in any course for a period of two years.
